Low coppice

- Current area of actively managed coppice forest = very limited; estimate: 200-300 ha of ash forests and 500-1,000 ha of oak forests

- These coppice forests are NOT commercially managed

- Substantial area (a few hundred ha) of willow coppice, commercially managed

High coppice (pollarding)

- Limited to individual trees or trees in a row

- Only a few willow stands (along the rivers) where pollarding is still in use

- Area: 10-20 ha

Coppice-with-standards (CWS)

- Limited proof that CWS was widely spread in the past

- Currently more interest in CWS due to the positive effects on biodiversity (it does still exist in the southern province of Limburg)

Short rotation coppice (SRC)

- Growing interest in establishing SRC, mainly on non-productive lands

- Estimated area: 65 ha

Tree species used in coppices

- Mainly oak and furthermore birch and beech

- In wetter sites: mainly ash, alder, and willow

Rotations

- Oak: 10-20 years

- Ash: 6-8 years

- Willows: 1-2 years
