Conference - Coppice Forests in Europe: a traditional natural resource with great potential

Hosted by COST Action FP1301 EuroCoppice & FCBA Limoges, France, 19 - 21 June, 2017



Dear Colleagues,

Extensive areas of broadleaf forest across Europe are of coppice origin or are still managed as coppice today. Depending on their geophysical conditions and cultural heritage, these coppice forests show a large diversity of species, silvicultural treatment and utilization. In history, coppicing was the earliest attempt at managing limited forest resources sustainably and was often developed for a specific local context. Coppice forests are resilient towards natural risks and provide a wide array of wood and non-wood forest products; their unique habitat also contributes to species biodiversity and to a variety of landscapes. Nevertheless, in the past decades coppicing has become less accepted, mainly due to high costs of traditional coppice operations and changing markets.

These days, with the rising importance of renewable energies and awareness of the positive effects of coppice forests for climate and nature protection, the interest in coppice is increasing. Beyond such environmental benefits, both traditional and new forms of coppice management can play an important role for labour and income in rural communities. In recognition of this "renaissance", COST Action FP1301 EuroCoppice was initiated in 2013; the aim was to address key issues, such as the possible contribution of a renewed coppice forestry to the growth and competitiveness of the regional and European forest-woodenergy sector, as well as the barriers limiting and measures necessary to make this vision a reality. Over 140 researchers from 35 countries have since collaborated on a variety of topics, from statistics, ecology and silviculture, to products, protection functions and governance.

The EuroCoppice Final Conference will be held from June 19th to 21st 2017 in Limoges (Central France), a region in which coppice forests are still quite dominant in regional forestry, industry and landscape. Since coppice forest operations and utilisation play such a crucial role in the future of coppice, the morning session of this conference is dedicated to related subjects. In the afternoon, the overall results of FP1301 EuroCoppice will be presented, followed by a panel discussion on the past, present and future of coppice with European stakeholders.

With this Call we invite all interested scientists and practitioners (from within or outside the COST Action) to submit an Abstract for the morning sessions of the conference, outlining a proposed oral presentation or poster – further details can be found in the following pages.

Conference Themes (Morning Session)

The following are titles & example topics for the presentation and posters related to coppice products and utilisation (June 21^{st} from 8:30 - 12:30).

The examples always refer to coppice forests in relation to the given topic.

- **1. Coppice products:** actual and potential offer of wood products from coppice forests; product quality issues (e.g. timber vs. ring shake or other defects etc.); innovative wood products; engineered timber products from coppice; coppice products and local business; coppice as a source of energy wood; firewood markets; coppice forests as a source of chips for the growing bioenergy sector;
- **2. Coppice harvesting technology and techniques**: performance studies (productivity and cost) of machines and systems deployed in coppice forests; specific harvesting technology issues related to coppice harvesting (e.g. handling multi-tree clumps); mechanization of coppice operations; whole tree chipping in coppice stands; new equipment for coppice operations (both low-tech and high-tech); effect of coppice stand characteristics and silviculture on harvesting performance and cost; logging companies/contractors involved with coppice harvesting; safety and ergonomics in coppice operations;
- **3. Environmental aspects of coppice operations:** site and tree impacts; regeneration after cutting (especially mechanical); soil disturbance and compaction in coppice operations; low-impact techniques; whole-tree harvesting in coppice forests and plant nutrition issues.

Submission of Abstracts

Abstracts for an oral presentation or poster can be submitted by any interested person(s).

They should include the following:

- affiliation(s),
- text no longer than 250 words
- 4 7 keywords &
- preference as to oral presentation or poster
